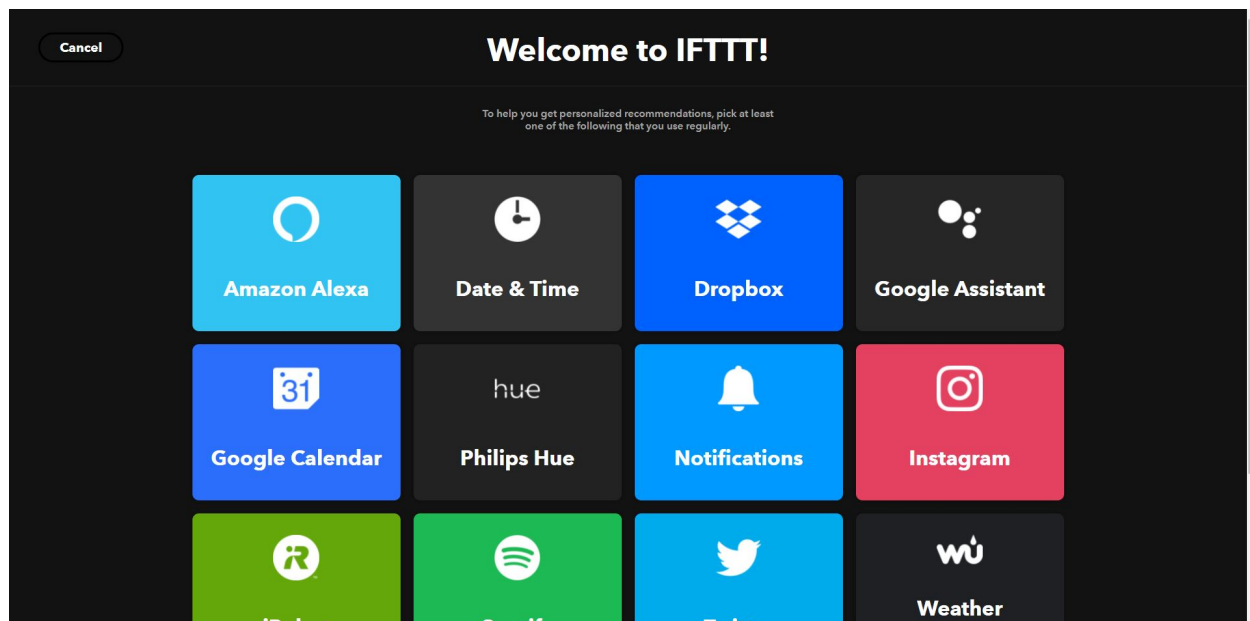


Guide for Using IFTTT

IFTTT stands for If This, Then That. The site uses logic recipes to make managing things like smart homes and social media accounts easier. To start with, you'll need to make an account here: <https://ifttt.com/>

Put in your email and click on "Get Started". From there, make a password. Decide on if you want to try your Premium trial now or later (more on that later).

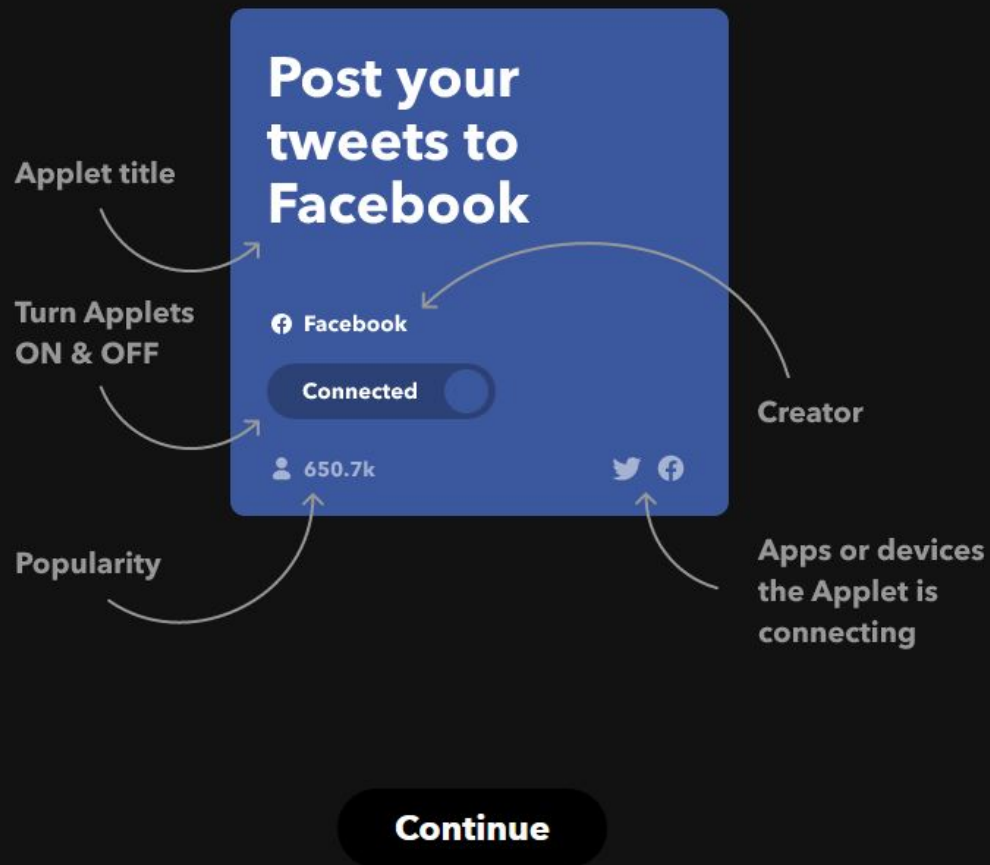
This part is where you'll decide on a particular site you use most. Facebook, Reddit, Twitter, Pinterest, they all have logic recipes to them.



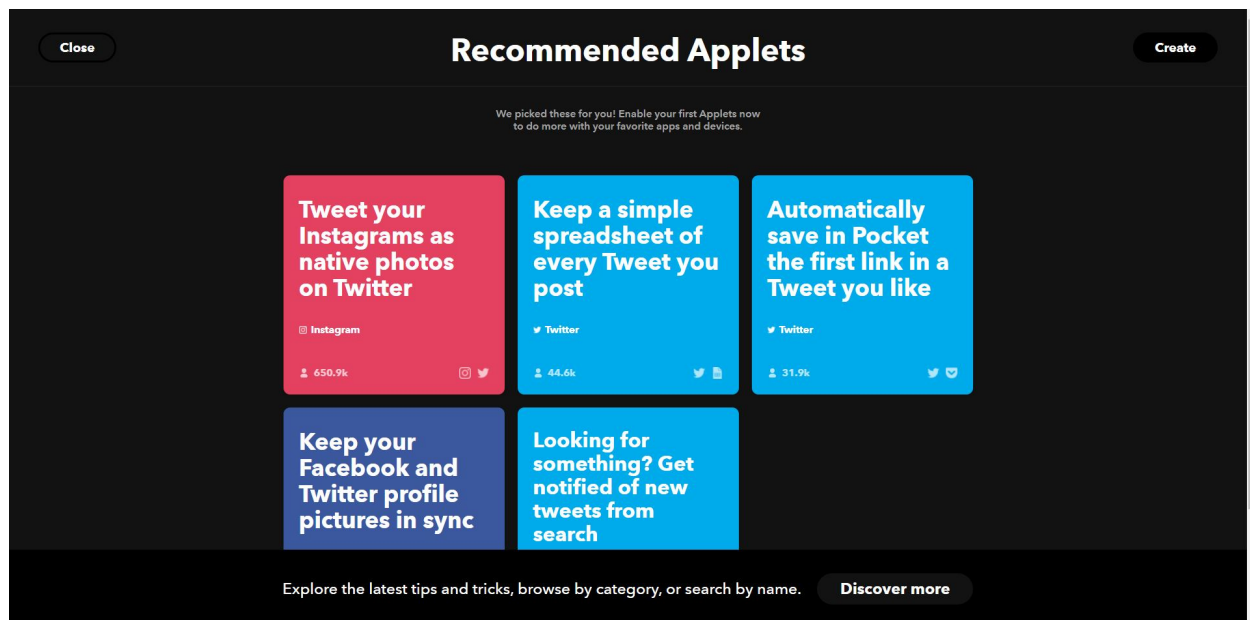
For this tutorial, we're going to pick Twitter, but you can pick any of the ones along the page to start with. Click on that, then click on "Continue" down at the bottom.

Introducing Applets

Applets are connections you can turn on between different apps & devices.

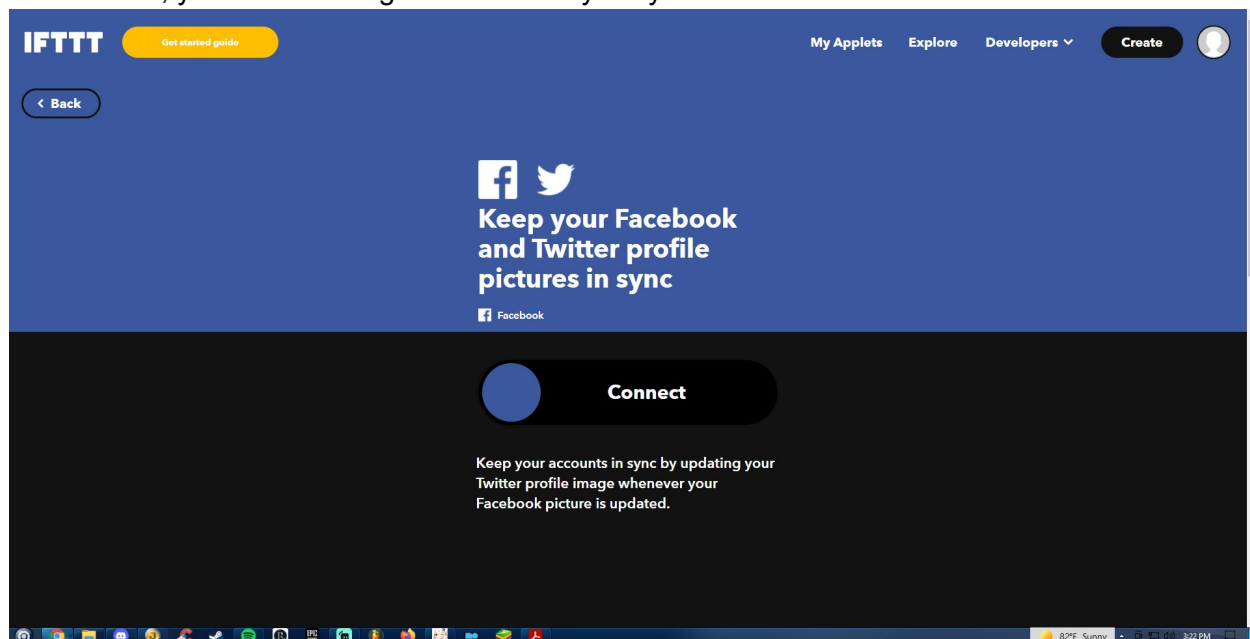


The only real important parts here is the Name, the button to turn on/off the applet, and the apps or devices the Applet is connecting. Other than that, we can move on by clicking on "Continue".

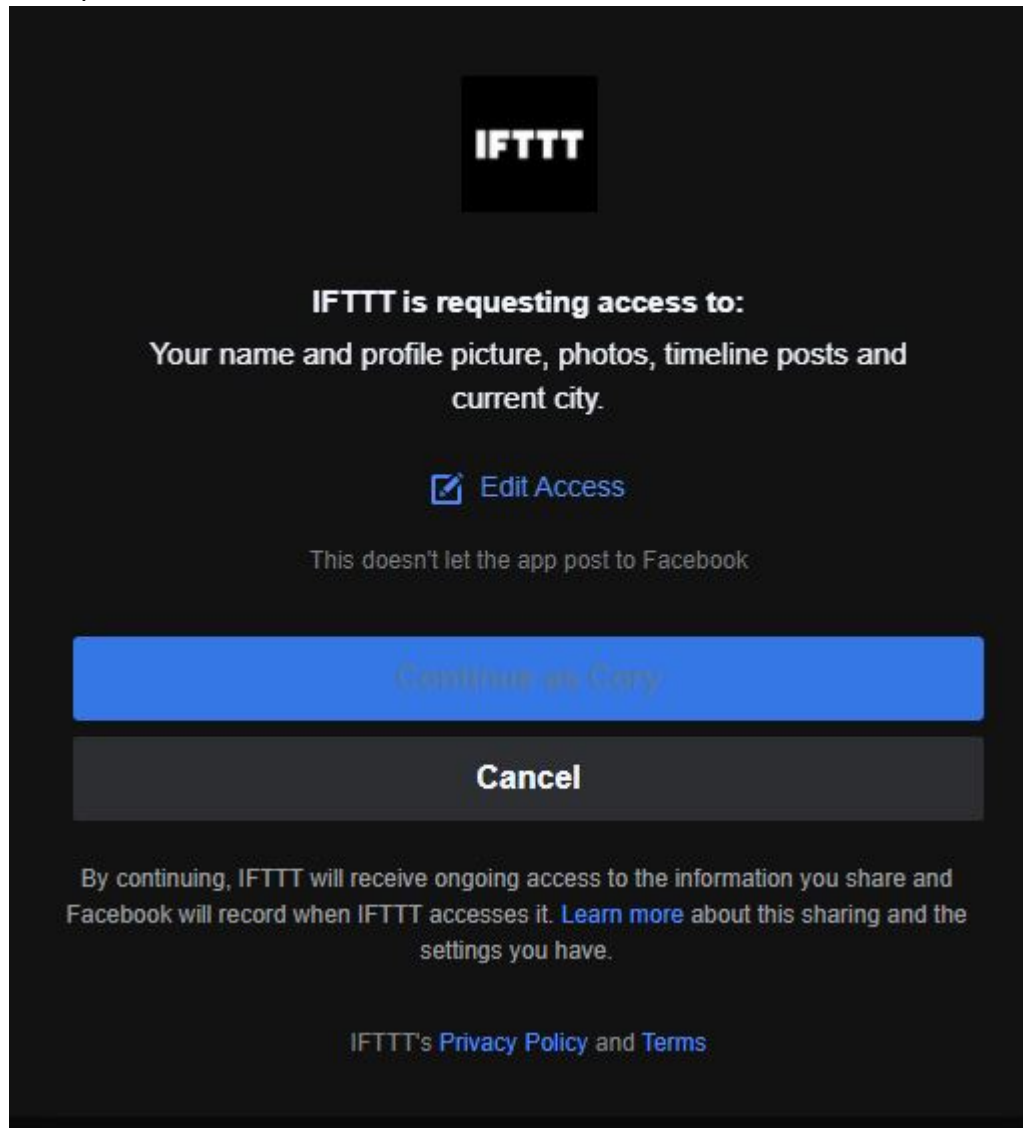


From there, it'll show you some applets it recommends adding for your account. They can be linked to much more if you go exploring, but you'll need to do that on your own later. For now, we'll click on "Keep your Facebook and Twitter profile pictures in sync".

When there, you'll see the big button that says "Sync"



Once you click on Connect, you'll be taken to the first website that you'll be connecting to. For example, Facebook was the first on the list for this one, so it'd look like this:



Click on "Continue as ____" and you'll have your Facebook connected to the applet. Do the same procedure for Twitter. After you get done with those, it'll take you to IFTTT's applet dashboard, where you can manage anything that app can do. Every app will have the option to "Get Notifications when this App is Active". It's optional to have that on, but I prefer to keep that on so I can know when the app does anything to my profiles.

This Action will update your profile picture from the image URL you specify and optionally tweet about it. NOTE: Please adhere to Twitter's Rules and Terms of Service.

Add a tweet (optional)

Each applet will have different things underneath the “Get notifications when this applet is active”. This applet in particular only goes off when something changes on your Twitter or Facebook profile, and it’ll do it automatically, no other input needed. If you want, you can add a tweet that will go out when it’s updated on Twitter, but that’s optional.

The program is free for up to 3 recipes, but anything beyond that requires Premium. The premium package is \$5.00/month and gives you access to unlimited recipes, quicker run times, and the ability to chain recipe steps together. If you want to use this, it’s advised you make some test accounts and play around with the recipes.
